- a passenger is hurt in a car crash

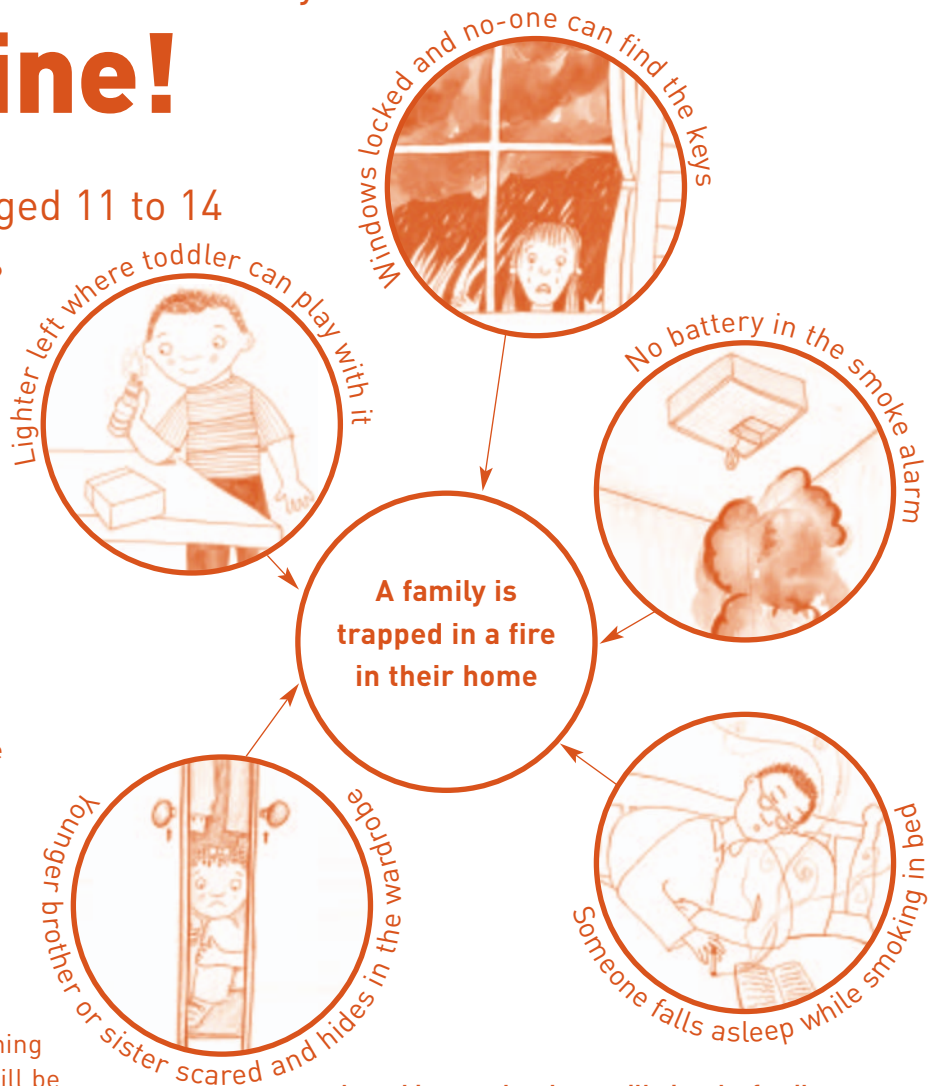
Choose one serious accident.
